

The residency program in General Surgery at Stony Brook University Medical Center ranks in the Top Ten of all surgical residency programs in New York for its composite pass rate on the board qualifying/certifying examinations.

- Founded in 1980, the Hospital serves a population of approximately 1.5 million residents.
- Among the region's finest, the Hospital is Suffolk County's only tertiary care center and Level 1 Trauma Center.
- The 594-bed Hospital is fully accredited by The Joint Commission.
- As a premier academic medical center, Stony Brook is responsible for healing the sick, educating skilled healthcare professionals, uncovering the complexities of disease and discovering new treatments, and reaching out to the community to inform and educate.
- Research expenditures recently totaled \$90,045,349 (July 2009–June 2010).
- The Medical Center occupies three quarters of a million square feet and stands 325 feet and 19 stories tall.
- The Hospital has the County's only Level I trauma center, regional perinatal center, burn center, bone marrow transplant program, and kidney transplant program.
- The Hospital is the only one in the County that is licensed to perform open heart surgery.
- Major economic contributor: \$1.4 billion economic impact annually.
